21 "New Roblans" Arrive -- To Establish Ennis Plant

Twenty-one "New Roblans" arrived here last week, and were continuing today their search for homes. The newcomers — five executives of the Ennis Tag and Salesbook Company—accompanied by their families, have been lodged temporarily in several Spring Street motels, and "like Paso Robles" but with the luxurious job of finding homes was all over.

The five Ennis officers will, according to General Manager Jack T. Tolleson, launch a training program for new employees "in about six weeks and we hope to be in full production by the first of the year," Tolleson added.

Presses and equipment to be installed in the city-owned hangar at Sherwood Acres, are being assembled at the company's main plant, in Ennis, Texas. The machinery will be tested at the home office before being trucked to Paso Robles. Four presses will be shipped "in the near future," and three more are scheduled for installation at a later date.

"We'll start manufacturing register forms, snap outs, carbon inter-leaf continuous forms, and teletype rolls, at first," Tolleson said. "Later we'll go into sales books, manifold books, etc."

The "key quintet" who will direct operations of the Paso Robles branch represent a combined total of 67 years of service with the Ennis Company. All except Tolleson are natives of Ennis, Texas, and all are graduates of the Ennis High School.

Tolleson (born in Rice, Texas) is a graduate of the University of Houston, and was employed by the Ennis Company in 1946.

Ben Barto, Paso Robles office manager, has been with the firm for 15 years "in a supervisory capacity in the main plant." Barto, whose wife last week accepted a teaching position in San Luis Obispo, will bring his five daughters to California "sometime next summer."

John Gram O'Neal, a 17-year veteran, will act as plant superintendent of the local operation, and Billy Charles White, after 10 years with the firm, has been named foreman of the salesbook presses.

Carbon manager at the Paso Robles plant will be James A. Nichols who recently completed his 15th years with Ennis.
